

MARKSMANSHIP

1. The .177 air rifle marksmanship competition will consist of one five-man team (scoring 4). All firing must be accomplished before 15 March 2002. Participating teams may shoot at the Admiral Farragut Academy Range or make arrangements to fire elsewhere. A postal match situation is acceptable for this event. Each school is responsible for providing or arranging for targets, pellets, weapons, and equipment. NRA Approved Targets AR-5/10 will be used. Targets will be scored by JUDGES on the day of the meet. "Do not plug or alter your targets." Doing so will result in no score and team disqualification for that event. To make arrangements to fire at Admiral Farragut contact the Naval Science Instructor at 384-1893.
2. Participating schools using the Farragut Range must be accompanied by the Instructor in order to control team firing and act as safety officer.
3. Any .177/853 Sporter air rifle with iron sights is authorized. The use of the "Scheutzen" hook and palm rest is prohibited. The kneeling roll may be used only in the kneeling position. No bench or wall support is permitted in any firing position.
4. After the presentation of safety instructions, one hour will be allowed for preparation time, target placement, and firing.
5. Challenges of official target scores by any instructor must be brought to the attention of the judge whose decision will be final.
6. Awards will be provided as follows:
